### 1. INTRODUCTION

Limabahau Sdn Bhd has commissioned TUV NORD (Malaysia) Sdn Bhd to conduct an annual surveillance four (04) audit for its oil palm estates according to MS 2530-3:2013 Part 3 General principles for Oil Palm Plantations and Organised Smallholders.

### 1.1. Objective

The objective of this surveillance four (04) audit is to assess the estates by an independent certification body with the aim for compliance of the standard.

### 1.2. Scope

The assessment is based on the documentation established by the Limabahau Sdn Bhd.

The supporting documents are provided to the audit team as well as information received by means of interviews and background investigation.

The documents and information are reviewed against the requirements and criteria based on MS 2530-3:2013 Part 3 General principles for Oil Palm Plantations and Organised Smallholders.

TUV NORD Malaysia has employed a risk-based approach in the audit, focusing on the identification of significant risks and reliability of the assessment and reporting.

The following references are used as part of the assessment; the compliance of the requirements out of the guidelines applied was checked:

- 1. Malaysian Sustainable Palm Oil Part 3: General Principles for Oil Palm Plantations and Organised Smallholders audit guidance;
- 2. Palm Oil Supply Chain Traceability Requirements.

### **On-site Assessment**

The audit of the estates are conducted according to the MS 2530-3:2013 Part 3 General principles for Oil Palm Plantations and Organised Smallholders.

The methodology for collection of objective evidence by means of physical site inspections, observation of tasks and processes, interview workers and operation personnel, review of documentation and data. Checklists and questionnaires were used to guide the collection of information.

Based on the formula, the sample size for the estates  $S = 1\sqrt{7} = 3$ , therefore round up to the next integral of 3 estates. Thus, a total of 3 estates selected for the onsite assessment and inspection as listed in Table 2-1 below:




Figure 1: Limabahau estate




Figure 2: Ableman estate




Figure 3: Newco – Tepuid Division





Figure 4: Newco - Beluran division




Figure 6: Emmal – Ketawan division





Figure 7: Wee Hing Plantations

### Figure 8: Layak Sama




Figure 9: Emson – 100 division




Figure 10: Emson – 200 division
